## **Panama: Journalists Call For Investigation Of Break-in At Notimex Offices**

On July 10, the Association of Foreign Journalists in Panama (ACOPEP) called on the government of President Guillermo Endara to investigate the July 9 break-in by unidentified persons at the offices of the Mexican government's international news service, Notimex, and a similar incident in May at the home of Notimex correspondent Edelmiro Franco. The Association statement said the assailants did not force entry, suggesting an intelligence gathering operation rather than a burglary or other common crime. (Basic data from AFP, 07/10/91)
