Nicaragua: Managua Bus Company Employee Strike Settled

On Aug. 25 in Managua, spokespersons for the National Bus Company (ENBUS) union told reporters they had suspended a two- day strike because government officials accepted the following demands: release of motors and spare parts to repair 135 city buses, and delivery of at least a portion of 100 buses purchased via a loan from the Spanish government, and 56 Isuzu buses donated by the Japanese government. Officials tentatively accepted another union demand that jurisdiction over ENBUS be moved from the Transportation and Construction Ministry to the People's Transportation Corporation (COTRAP).
