## **Guatemala: Clandestine Grave Site In Panquiac, El Quiche**

Cesar Guadamuz, deputy human rights attorney general, recently told journalists that residents of Panquiac, El Quiche department, discovered a clandestine grave containing the remains of 13 to 18 persons. Guadamuz said the villagers had hesitated to contact authorities for fear of army reprisals. Panquiac is located near the area where Argentine and Guatemalan forensic experts have unearthed the remains of 26 persons at two common graves sites.
