El Salvador: Government & Rebels Accept Invitation By U.N. Secretary General To Meet In New York

In an Aug. 28 letter to UN Security Council president Jose Ayala Lasso, UN Secretary General Javier Perez de Cuellar indicated that he had invited President Alfredo Cristiani and Farabundo Marti National Liberation Front (FMLN) leaders to participate in a mid-September meeting at UN headquarters in New York. The invitation is aimed at breaking the stalemate in the peace talks. On the following day, the FMLN released a communique accepting Perez de Cuellar's offer. Vice President Francisco Merino told reporters that the government would participate in the talks held in New York. (Basic data from AFP, EFE, 08/28/91)
