Colombia To Receive \$41 Million In Economic Aid From U.S.

On Feb. 26 in Washington, the US Agency for International Development announced during President Cesar Gaviria's visit to Washington that Bogota will receive \$41 million in aid. The funds are earmarked for trade, public services, regional economic development, offsetting anti-drug program costs and coca crop substitution. According to an aid agreement signed Feb. 25, "The fiscal year 1991 accord recognizes Colombia's leadership in the battle against the production and supply of illicit drugs. It provides economic aid to help ease the damage to the Colombian economy caused by the drug war." (Basic data from AFP, 02/26/91)
