On Sept. 1, Bertha Oliva, spokesperson for the Committee of Relatives of the Disappeared (COFADEH), called on the government of President Rafael Callejas to create a commission of international observers to investigate the cases of 143 persons disappeared over the past 10 years. Oliva said COFADEH was disgusted with former presidents Jose Azcona Hoyo (1986-90) and Roberto Suazo Cordova (1982-86) and former armed forces chiefs Gens. Policarpo Paz and Walter Lopez, all of whom refused to participate in a public forum on the disappeared. (Basic data from ACAN-EFE, 09/01/91)
