Poll Of Guatemala City Residents Shows Declining Enthusiasm For Serrano Administration

According to survey results published in the Oct. 18 issue of the magazine Cronica, support for President Jorge Serrano among capital city residents has dropped off over the first nine months of his administration. The poll, conducted by Aragon and Associates in September, was based on a sample of 264 women and 244 men. Results indicated that 36% of respondents said they were "satisfied" with the Serrano administration, compared to 71% in a similar poll conducted in January. In the September poll, 11% of respondents said they were "completely dissatisfied," and 53%, "satisfied" or "somewhat satisfied." (Basic data from ACAN-EFE, 10/18/91)
