Salvadoran Anti-communist Front Communique

On Oct. 29, daily newspaper Diario de Hoy published a communique by the Major Armando Azmitia Anti-Communist Front. The Front called on "valiant Salvadoran soldiers" to demand that the government halt concessions to the rebels, described as "terrorist assassins." Government officials who signed the agreement with the rebels on Sept. 25 in New York were labeled "traitors." The Front takes its name from Maj. Armando Azmitia, an army officer killed in 1983 in a clash with rebels. (Basic data from AFP, 10/29/91)
