Ten Central American Parliament Delegates Resign

On Nov. 4, Central American Parliament (PARLACEN) secretary Jorge Canale Nanne told reporters that 10 delegates to the regional forum had resigned since the Oct. 28 inauguration of PARLACEN. The former delegates are Guatemalans Manuel Conde (Secretary General), Antulio Castillo (political affairs secretary to President Jorge Serrano), and Juan Jose Serra (Ambassador to Spain); Salvadorans Roberto D'Aubuisson, Mercedes Gloria Salguero Gross, Raul Antonio Pena Flores and Guillermo Antonio Guevara Lacayo; Hondurans Leonardo Matute Murillo (Attorney General), Mario Rivera Liez and Tomas Quinonez. Canale said that the resignations had been submitted for a variety of reasons. All 10 representatives will be replaced by their alternates. (Basic data from ACAN-EFE, 11/04/91)
