On Dec. 12, the Nicaraguan Foreign Ministry reported that US Secretary of State James Baker has warned Managua that a recent spate of violence could have a "negative impact" on foreign aid. The warning was stated in a recent letter to the ministry. The ministry's statement emphasized that the message was an expression of concern over what might happen "in case violence flares again."
