On Jan. 10 in Madrid, Spanish Defense Ministry spokespersons told reporters that 138 Spanish soldiers and 50 Civil Guard and National Police officers would join the UN observer mission to El Salvador (ONUSAL). The spokespersons indicated said Spanish Gen. Victor Suanzes would serve as commander for the 188 officers. Suanzes formerly headed the UN mission in Central American (ONUCA).
