## **Chile: First Week Of Strike At El Teniente Mine Causes \$3 Million In Financial Losses**

On Aug. 7, striking employees at the El Teniente copper mine resumed negotiations with management, or the state-run Copper Corporation (CODELCO). According to CODELCO spokespersons, the mine accumulated over \$3 million in financial losses during the first week of the strike. El Teniente, Chile's largest subterranean mine, accounts for a quarter of copper export revenue. (Basic data from AFP, 08/07/91)
