In 1990, Brazilian exports to Hungary totaled \$179.8 million. Brazilian imports from the central European nation were less than exports by a factor of almost nine. Major exports to Hungary consist of soybean meal, unroasted coffee beans and instant coffee, cacao derivatives, cotton textiles, steel wire and cable, and tin. Imports are dominated by chemical products; machinery; optical, measurement, precision and photography instruments and equipment; and medical and surgical tools and equipment.
