Colombian Coffee Producers Committed To Resumption Of Global Quota System

On Aug. 13 in Bogota, Jorge Cardenas Gutierrez, manager of the National Coffeegrowers Federation, said Colombian producers will continue to insist on the re-establishment of a global quota system. The experience of the last two years, he added, has been negative for all coffee producer-nations. The International Coffee Organization's quota system collapsed in July 1989. On Aug. 13, Colombian coffee was quoted at \$0.86 cents per pound in New York. (Basic data from EFE, 08/13/91)
