U.S.-honduran Joint Military Maneuvers

On March 14, joint US-Honduran military exercises commenced at the Palmerola air base. Objectives of the maneuvers included training in tactical and logistical procedures, and use of communications systems. According to a statement released in Tegucigalpa, the maneuvers were scheduled to conclude on March 25. Participants in the maneuvers include an undisclosed number of personnel from the US Army and Air Force, the Honduran army's four infantry brigades, and Honduran military communications engineers. About 1,200 US troops are stationed at the Palmerola base. (Basic data from Agence France-Presse, 03/16/92)
