Costa Rica: January-february Trade Deficit

On March 20, the Central Bank reported a US\$45.1 million trade deficit for the first two months of the year, down 38% compared to the same period in 1991. Export revenue increased by 16.3%. The private consulting firm Consejeros Economicos y Financieros (CEFSA) predicts a 4.4% increase in export income for the year. Central Bank economists project 9% increase in import spending in 1992. Beginning in April, tariffs on most imported products will be no higher than 20%, resulting in an overall price decline for imports.
