Bolivia & Chile Request Observer Status In Mercosur For 1992

On Oct. 31, the Agence France-Presse cited unidentified diplomatic sources in Asuncion (Paraguay) as saying that in 1992, Bolivia and Chile will have observer status in MERCOSUR. MERCOSUR member-nations are Argentina, Brazil, Paraguay and Uruguay. Chilean Foreign Minister Enrique Silva Cimma has reiterated on several occasions that his government is willing to join MERCOSUR when the economies of current member-nations have achieved the level of trade liberalization and price stability characterizing the Chilean economy.
