## **Nicaragua: On Plans For Womens' Radio Station**

On Nov. 18, journalist Ada Luz Monterrey said that on Dec. 4, a new radio station, run for and by women, will begin broadcasting. Monterrey, who will direct the new station, said programming will be based on the concept of direct communication and interaction with the listening audience. Monterrey, who currently directs the popular El Atabal program on the Sandinista National Liberation Front's (FSLN) Radio Sandino, said this will be the first womens' station in the country. There are currently 15 special radio shows, broadcast on different stations, dedicated exclusively to issues such as sexuality, family planning, and abortion.
