## A GUIDE TO THE LITERATURE OF THE SOUTHWEST, XXXV

**T**HIS BIBLIOGRAPHY, a service of the University of New Mexico's Research Bureau on Latin America and Cultural Relations in the Southwest, the School of Inter-American Affairs, the Department of Sociology, and the *New Mexico Quarterly*, attempts to list, with such thoroughness as time and resources permit, current materials dealing with the Southwest. The Southwest, as here defined, includes all of New Mexico, Arizona and Texas, and parts of Utah, Oklahoma, Colorado, Nevada and California.

The symbol (F) designates fiction; (J) is used to indicate materials on the juvenile level.

In order to conserve space, items from periodicals that are indexed in the *Readers' Guide to Periodical Literature*, the *Education Index*, and the *Industrial Arts Index* have been eliminated.

Included in this issue are mainly those titles which were published or came to our attention between June 1 and August 31.

Distribution of the film is limited to subscribers of the paper edition. The microfilm is prepared at a high reduction ration, it is remarkably clear and sharp, and when used with a reader gives an entirely satisfactory enlargement of 19 times or more. There are now 750 titles available under this service.
