Expansion of services characterized the work of the Health Sciences Library and Informatics Center (HSLIC) in fiscal year 2007 (FY2007).

### Education

The primary impetus for service expansion was the Domenici Center for Health Sciences Education (Domenici Center), which opened for classes in January. Several areas of HSLIC played key roles: Administration oversaw the creation and implementation of services, and Administration's Facility Management section assumed responsibility for maintaining the building; Technology Support analyzed audio-visual needs and oversaw the purchasing of the equipment; and Library Services assumed the responsibility for scheduling certain classrooms and conference rooms. Special Collections mounted the first photo exhibit in the building as part of the Hall of Discovery.

### Research

Another major service expansion related to the areas of both research and education grew from HSLIC faculty and staff participation in developing the Health Sciences Center's (HSC's) proposal for a Clinical Translational Science Center grant. If this grant is funded, HSLIC might be responsible for the Biomedical Informatics Support Unit to support the Center. As part of the proposal the HSC initiated a program leading to a Masters Degree in Clinical Research, and HSLIC faculty coordinated the development of a course, *Introduction to Biomedical Informatics*, within this program. This eight-week course will be taught annually by HSLIC faculty and covering topics that include basic biomedical informatics concepts, scholarly communication issues, evidence-based searching of the biomedical literature, and citation management tools.

### Clinical/Service

HSLIC's Native American Health Information Services program attracted funding allowing the

expansion of its role as a national leader in the area. In July 2006, HSLIC was funded to host a national conference for organizations which provide health information to Native Americans; subsequently, HSLIC received additional funding to support creation of a web portal using participatory networking to continue the collaboration begun at the 2006 conference. Additionally, the National Library of Medicine asked HSLIC to plan and host a meeting to facilitate NLM's planning of a major exhibit, Native American Concepts of Health and Illness; this meeting occurred in December, with 19 representatives of Native American tribes or nations and 10 NLM personnel in attendance.

### Technology

HSLIC's successful support of information technology at the Health Sciences Center resulted in the expansion of collaboration to the main campus of UNM. Holly Buchanan, Associate Vice President for Knowledge Management & Information Technology, HSC and HSLIC Director, was appointed Deputy Chief Information Officer for UNM as well as Chief Information Officer for the Health Sciences Center. A newly formed IT Managers' Council brings together IT managers UNM-wide to address issues of standards and governance and to provide new unification in IT services.

### Administration

In addition to the role of Administration in the oversight and management of the Domenici Center and in technology services, Administration supported HSLIC efforts to strengthen the Association of Academic Research Libraries of New Mexico (AARL of NM). The AARL of NM hosted the first ever "Summer Summit," a meeting for academic research library leaders and university administrators, resulting in increased awareness of issues faced by libraries in providing information services.

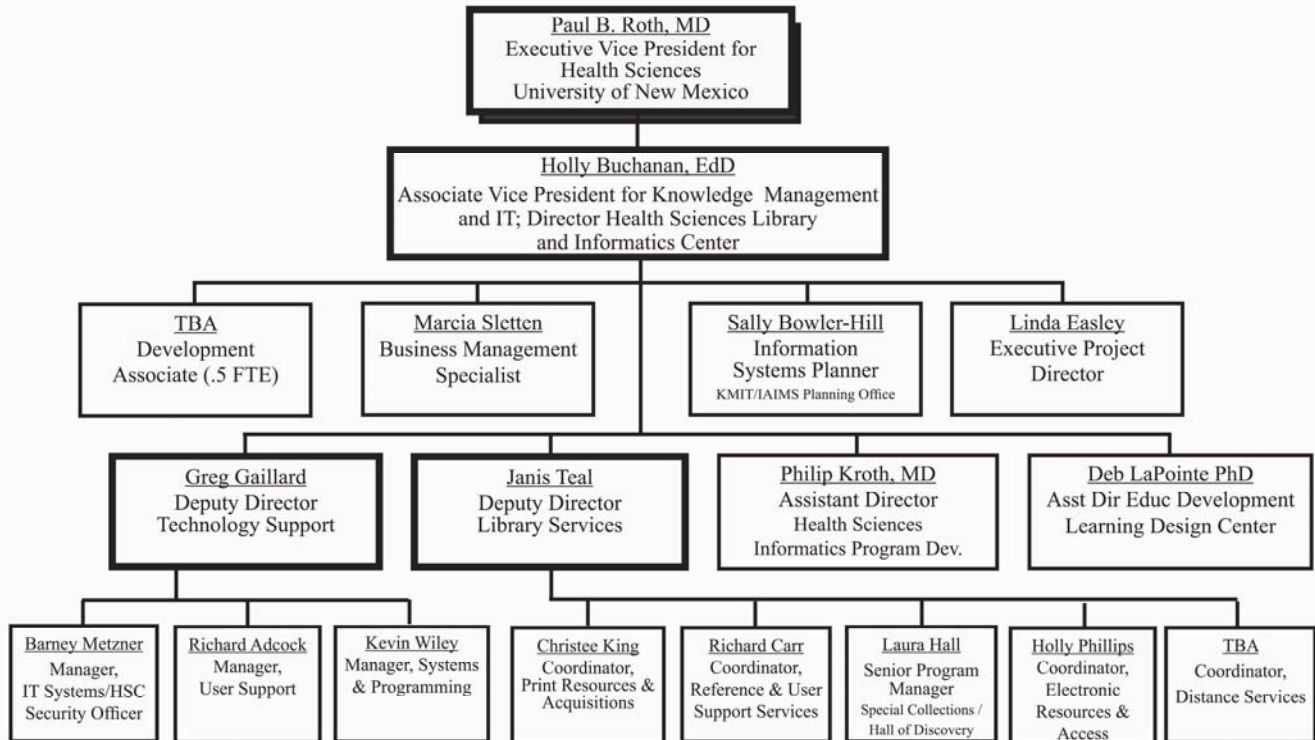

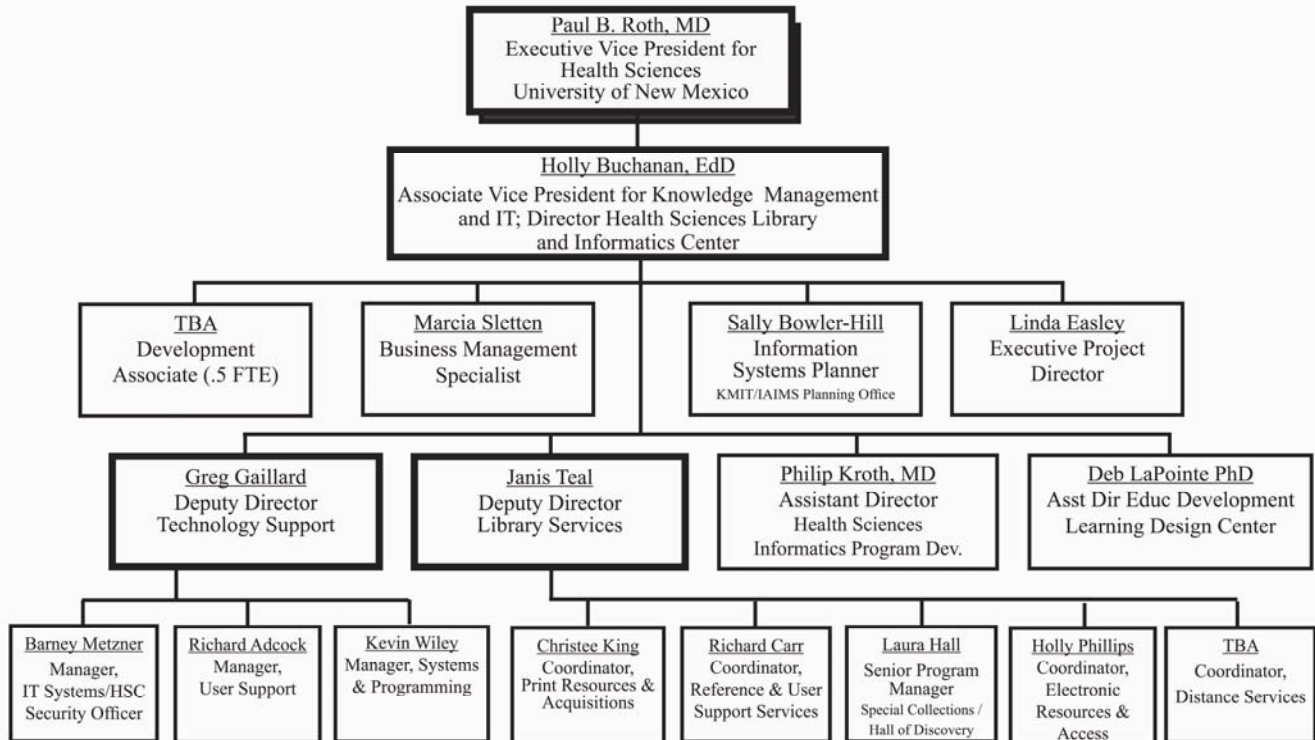
## ORGANIZATIONAL CHARTS

### The University of New Mexico Health Sciences Library and Informatics Center



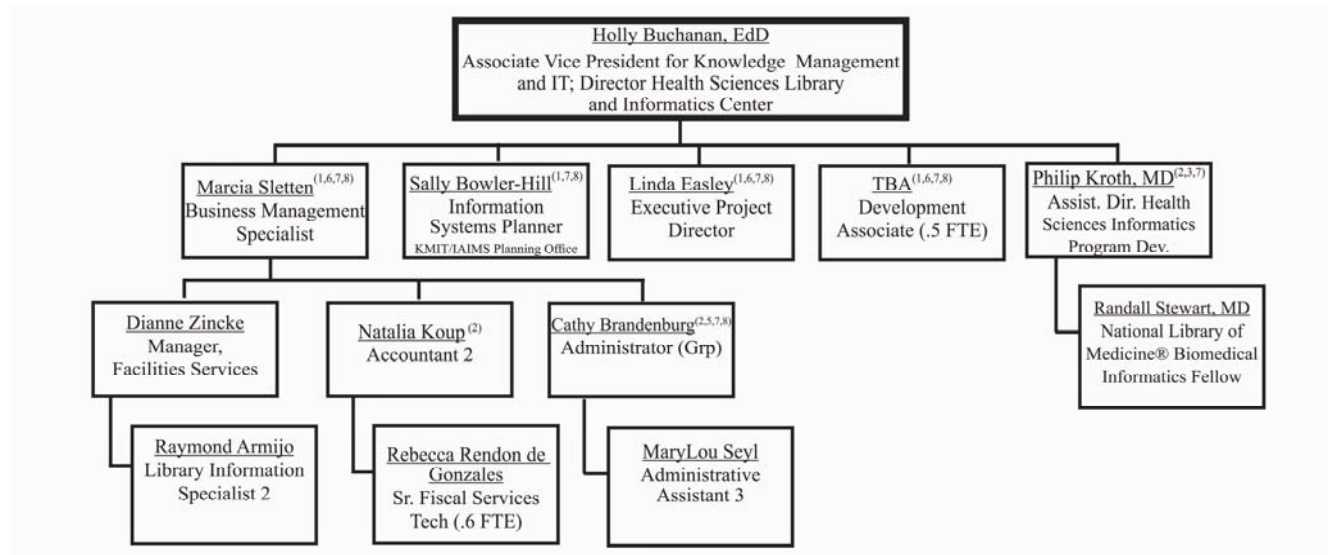
Organizational Chart Revision, May 2007

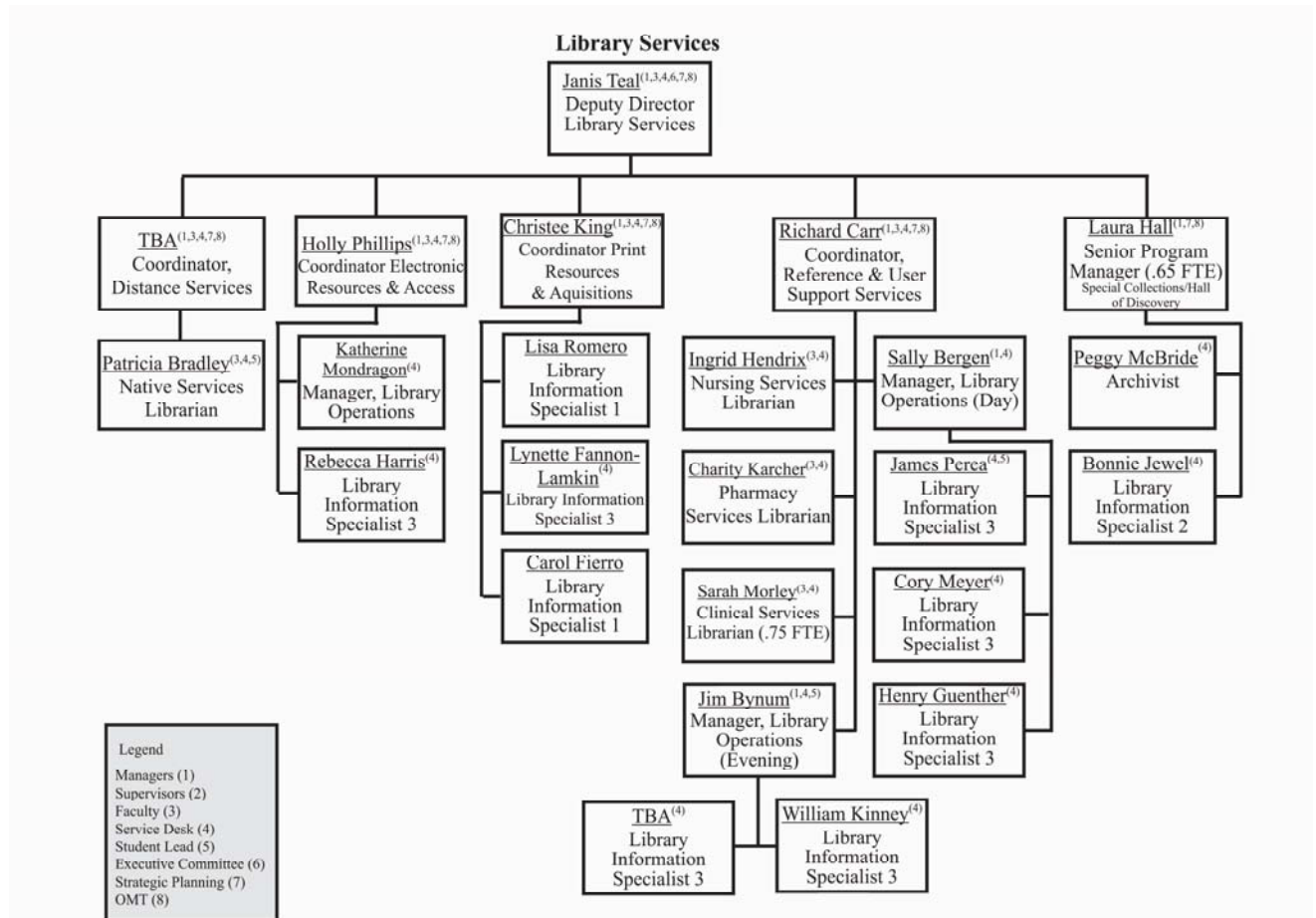


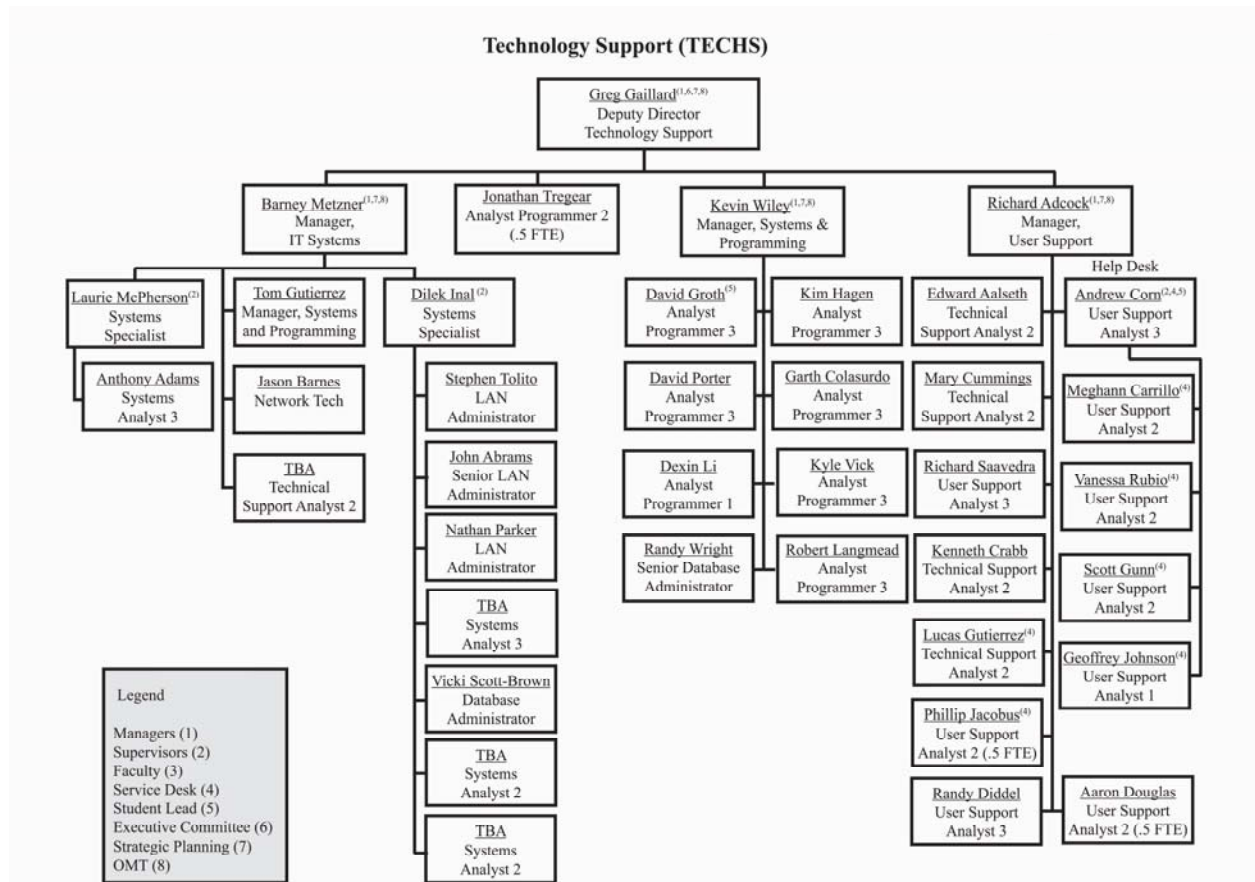
Organizational Chart Revision, May 2007

and Administration**

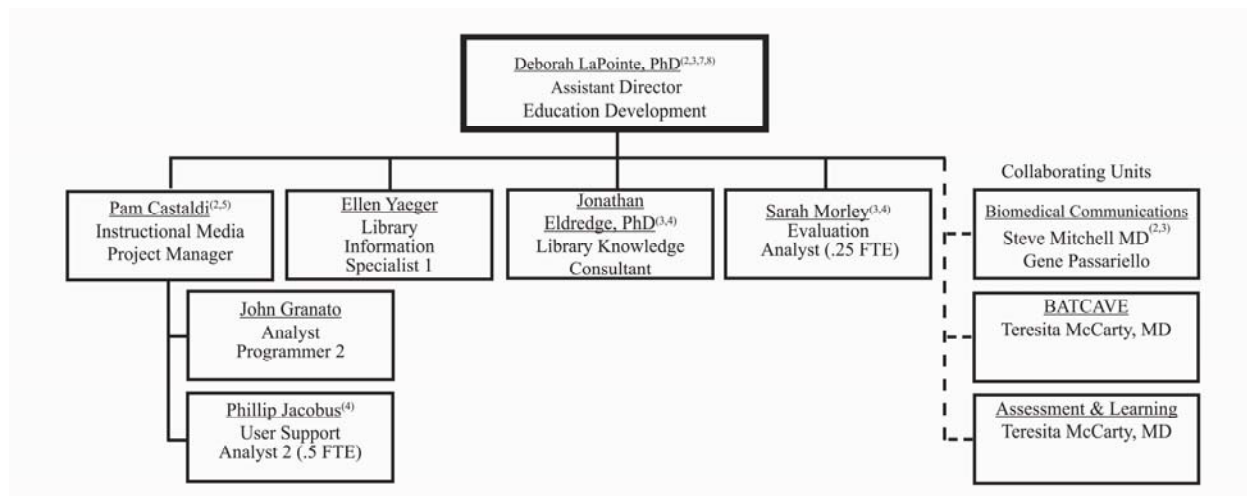

# UNIT ACCOMPLISHMENTS





## ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES

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### BUSINESS SERVICES

The Health Sciences Library and Informatics Center's (HSLIC) Business Services unit continued its successes in FY2007 through expansion of services to internal customers and patrons.

#### Accounting

The accounting unit worked on expanding their partnerships with HSC Financial Services by improving processes such as the incorporation of more accrual accounting processes. In accrual accounting, large dollar collection license renewals are charged as prepaid and then expended evenly throughout the year. This improves HSLIC's income statement and forecasting for the year. Accounting also assumed the task of reconciling and closing out sponsored projects, a task formerly done by Administration.

Accounting partnered with RUSS (Reference and User Support Services) to improve cash management process. The resulting segregation of duties allows for better controls of this important function. Partnership with HSLIC's Executive Committee also led to improvements in reporting to HSLIC management. Business Services and Executive Committee members developed a reporting process for accurate fiscal year forecasting and for a project tracking system to record HSLIC's support of various HSC components.

#### Facility Management

The Facilities Unit, in partnership with the Office of Capital Projects, HSC Physical Plant Department (PPD) and UNM Information Technology Services (Telecommunications) continued to improve and renovate HSLIC throughout the year. In a major expansion of Facility Management responsibility, HSLIC assumed responsibility for facility management of the Domenici Center for Health Sciences Education. Staff members collaborated in the opening of the building and with addressing "new building" issues, as its approximately 49,500 square feet has

added new challenges. Other large projects included conversion of the anatomy display windows to sliding glass doors and a complete remodeling of a conference room (216C). In addition a new privacy booth was created on the 4<sup>th</sup> floor to provide a place for health care providers to hold private conversations on their cell phones. Funding from PPD allowed additional significant improvements: re-sealing the east windows, re-surfacing the center stairwell, replacing worn out carpeting, and resurfacing of the roof.

#### Administration

The administrative unit continued its integration into the business services unit with an expansion of duties to include time and leave reporting. Their partnerships with other HSLIC units led to their assisting with preparation for the Association of Research Libraries of New Mexico Summer Summit, the Conference on Native American Health Information Services in the United States, and the December National Library of Medicine Exhibit Planning Meeting.

The administrative unit continued working with HSLIC and its constituents to create marketing material. In addition, the administrative unit began assisting the director with streamlining documentation and meeting preparation to meet the demands of the dynamic environment of an Associate Vice Presidents Office.

#### Human Resources

Human resources supported recruitment of 16 staff positions in FY2007, resulting in 12 hires, of which all but one were new hires to HSLIC. In addition, HSLIC's turnover rate of 9.4% is again lower than the University's rate of 11.4%. Business services staff created new employee files, allowing for better organization of HR documentation. Once again this past spring, HSLIC had a 100% return rate in the performance review process.

## FUND DEVELOPMENT

HSLIC's fledgling development plan took a few steps forward during fiscal year 2006-07, but the actual implementation of the development plan awaits the hiring of a new Director of Development for the Health Sciences Center.

The seeds of HSLIC's development plan were planted during the strategic planning process for 2005-2007, with the formulation of a goal to diversify funding sources. Meeting over the next two years, the fund diversification group completed a variety of planning activities including an environmental scan, needs assessment, interviews, SWOT analysis, focus group, and market analysis.

HSLIC's needs assessment and draft five-year development plan were incorporated intact into the Health Sciences Center's needs assessment document, which was later subsumed by the UNM Needs Assessment draft document. This document is under review by the new UNM President, and the University is preparing for a capital campaign.

Meanwhile, HSLIC's plan to hire development staff is on hold pending the hire of a Director of Development for the Health Sciences Center, which should happen in the first half of 2008.

In spite of the delay in hiring development staff, HSLIC did experience some progress in the area of development during 2006-07. In October, HSLIC staff voted on development priorities, selecting the Collections Endowment as the top priority followed by the Information Technology Endowment and the Sculpture Garden of Healing. In November, HSLIC hosted Samuel T. Huang, Associate Dean for External Relations, The University of Arizona Libraries, who spoke to faculty and staff about the benefits of development programs for academic libraries. Finally, by the end of 2006, donations from HSLIC faculty and staff increased the amount in the Collections for the Elderly Fund to the \$10,000 needed to convert the fund into an endowment.

## HEALTH SCIENCES BIOMEDICAL INFORMATICS PROGRAM

2006-2007 marked another year of growth in the HSLIC Biomedical Informatics Program, involving partnering to plan the Clinical Translational Science Center (CTSC) and the expansion of service partnerships.

HSLIC's Assistant Director for Health Sciences Informatics Program Development, Philip Kroth, M.D., M.S., was named the director of the CTSC Biomedical Informatics Support Unit. In this capacity he authored the biomedical informatics section of the one year planning grant that was funded to develop the resources necessary to apply for, and procure, a Clinical Translational Science Center award at the University of New Mexico Health Sciences Center. In addition to coordinating the writing for the biomedical informatics section of the full CTSC grant application (planned for submission in October, 2007) he also coordinated the development of a course in the CTSC's Master's program, *Introduction to Biomedical Informatics*. This 8-week course will be taught annually by HSLIC faculty and covers topics that include basic biomedical informatics concepts, scholarly communication issues, evidence-based searching of the biomedical literature, and citation management tools.

HSLIC's first biomedical informatics research fellow, Randall Stewart, M.D., continued to make progress on his research project which is designed to determine whether the presence of an electronic medical record in a behavioral health patient encounter affects the patient's perceptions of the mental health provider and the quality of the services received. Dr. Stewart coordinated the installation and configuration of the UNMH's Cerner Millennium electronic medical record system into the Behavioral Health clinics where his study is being conducted.

The service partnership with the UNM Human Tissue Repository and Experimental Pathology Laboratory continued to expand as the number of samples

entered into the repository increased from 80 to 2002, in addition to the 2484 samples from the first satellite repository. In addition, the repository began coding all of its tissue samples with SNOMED codes (a National Library of Medicine terminology standard for tissue type, anatomic location, and pathologic diagnosis.) This coding significantly improves the functionality of the repository's database, as investigators will be able to search for tissue based on exact tissue types, anatomical locations, and pathologic diagnoses. In addition, the coding provides the capability to potentially link this data with other extra-institutional tissue repositories in the future. HSLIC manages the Oracle servers for this project and provides consultation from HSLIC's biomedical informatics faculty.

The collaboration between HSLIC and RIOS Net, New Mexico's practice-based research network (PBRN) exceeded all of the IT and informatics goals outlined for the project's NIH contract by creating and supporting standardized data collection and storage tools for RIOS Net research projects. This work represents the culmination of the three year contract.

## PLANNING OFFICE

In FY2007 the Planning Office expanded its services to assist HSLIC with its evolving roles in the areas of Native American Health Information Services and information technology governance. In December, the Planning Office convened and hosted a consultation for the National Library of Medicine's (NLM's) proposed exhibition: Native American Concepts of Health and Illness. Twenty-one representatives of various Native American tribes and ten NLM personnel and contractors met for a day-and-a-half to discuss four major topical areas identified by the NLM for inclusion in the proposed exhibit. These areas included:

- Traditional views of wellness, illness, and treatment
- Lessons learned from previous Native American museum exhibits
- Personal observations of Native American health problems and contributions to health
- Current issues and future visions

In addition, the Planning Office coordinated three-and-a-half days of meetings between the NLM personnel and representatives from the Santa Fe Indian Hospital as well as Acoma, Laguna, and Jemez Pueblos to learn more about these communities. The relationships created for this consultation added an additional dimension to HSLIC's burgeoning Native American Health Information Services program.

The Planning Office expanded the promotion of the concepts of integrated information systems

management by building on cross-campus connections for IT (information technology) governance. Specifically, the Planning Office began to provide administrative and facilitation support for a new committee of IT managers from across the university including HSLIC, University of New Mexico Hospital IT, UNM Information Technology Services and the Center for High Performance Computing. The IT Managers Council began meeting monthly in January and, by the end of the fiscal year had provided input on a new UNM policy, two related IT standards, and a charter for a new Identity Management Task Force. This expansion will begin to address the lack of UNM-wide IT integration and communication identified by external reviewers during the 2005 review of the UNM HSC KMIT (Knowledge Management and Information Technology) program.

Finally, the Planning Office expanded its assessment activities by partnering with the UNM Chief Information Officer's office in piloting a new national IT services assessment tool called Higher Education TechQual+. Higher Education TechQual+ is modeled after the library services survey LibQUAL+®, which has been used by HSLIC since 2003. Adoption of this tool will move HSLIC toward a more unified assessment program between Library Services and TECHS. In April, HSLIC and the CIO's Office hosted the developer of the survey, Timothy Chester, PhD, of Pepperdine University, who conducted five focus groups on campus to refine the survey instrument. At the end of FY2007, a test survey on HSLIC and ITS personnel was underway with plans to pilot the instrument at UNM in the fall.

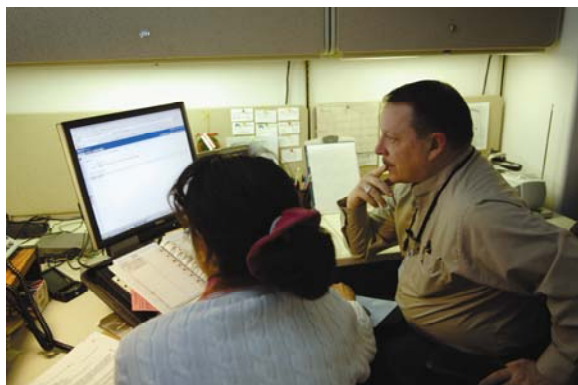


## EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT

### LEARNING DESIGN CENTER

Working in partnership with the faculty, staff, and students of the Health Sciences Center has always been the foundation of the work of the Learning Design Center (LDC). The LDC, a multidisciplinary learning technology team, works with faculty and staff to design and develop online curricula to support compliance, curricula, and employee professional development at the HSC. During the past year, the LDC expanded its partnerships and extended its services beyond the HSC. The LDC collaborated on three major initiatives that extend support throughout New Mexico, the United States, and beyond. The three major initiatives are 1) provisioning an open source learning management system, Moodle; 2) designing and completing the Tobacco Cessation CD and Web site; and 3) participating in the design of the curriculum and technology for the Master of Science in Clinical Research.

The implementation of Moodle enabled compliance training to be provided to non-academic learners. During the past year, systems administration and application support have been clearly delineated, a permanent Moodle application administrator named, and plans for the installation and testing of updates defined. The LDC supports HSC faculty who design and teach Moodle courses and the participants and students enrolled in those courses. Additionally, the LDC founded and convened the UNM Moodle Designers Group. The group meets bi-monthly and co-designs solutions requested by Moodle users. Courses offered in Moodle include Emergent Literacy

for Preschoolers, Border Health Awareness, Evidence-based Library and Information Practice, Preceptor Development Curricula, and Training for Shippers & Transporters of Radiopharmaceuticals and are reflected in Table 3, Training Courses.

The demand for effective tobacco cessation education readily available for residents and other healthcare professionals throughout New Mexico has been growing. The LDC, working with UNMH Patient Education, designed and completed a five-module CD and online course with videoclips and quizzes, entitled, "Tobacco Cessation." The content was pilot tested, and 900 final CDs were distributed to residents, the College of Pharmacy, School of Medicine, the New Mexico Medical Society and others throughout the state. The Tobacco Cessation course is one of the online courses managed by the LDC in Learning Central and is included in Table 3.

Another major initiative at the HSC is the development of the Clinical Translational Science Center (CTSC), whose purpose is to expand the reach of clinical medical research from the laboratory to clinical practice and into the community. An essential part of the CTSC initiative is the development of the newly approved Masters of Science in Biomedical Sciences with a concentration in Clinical Research. The LDC participated in the strategic planning for the degree, program and course designs, preparations to teach the Biomedical Informatics course, and integration of educational technology. The LDC trained faculty to use WebCT Vista to enhance their courses and planned student orientations. Web-enhanced courses offered in academic programs, like the MS-CR, at the HSC are reflected in Table 2, Web-based Curricular Courses Using WebCT.

Finally, the LDC expanded the variety of its services by hosting a series of monthly brown bag sessions on the use of technology in education, research, and daily productivity. Topics included PDAs for the Classroom and Research, SmartPhones, Podcasting, Moodle, Web conferencing, and Wikis. Attendees included HSC faculty and staff as well as interested learners throughout the local community.

## LIBRARY SERVICES

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### ELECTRONIC RESOURCES & ACCESS

In FY2007 the Electronic Resources and Access (ER&A) unit actively worked to expand the quality and variety of services available to HSLIC patrons in a number of ways. ER&A members selected and implemented a new link resolver in order to simplify access to HSLIC-held electronic journals from databases such as PubMed, CINAHL, PsycINFO and IPA. Most notably, the link resolver enabled patrons direct access to almost 70% more HSLIC-owned articles through PubMed – the most frequently used database on the HSC Campus – than with the previous article linking solution. Additionally, patrons can access all journal articles managed by HSLIC within one click of the mouse from a referring database instead of needing to navigate extra screens.

ER&A was also pleased to be able to offer to facilitate access to several new electronic products in FY2007. In response to feedback requesting off-campus access to a point-of-care health information resource, ER&A evaluated, selected, and began to offer DynaMed. DynaMed is available to all UNM affiliates with an

Internet connection, wherever they may be, making this resource truly point-of-care and point-of-need. In keeping with recognizing that library users are a geographically diverse group and need 24x7 access to library resources, ER&A contributed to a project to acquire a collection of electronic books by ensuring easy and reliable on- and off-site access to the new ebook collection.

Other projects and skill training undertaken by ER&A in FY2007 included streamlining our statistical gathering methods – the result of which eased the gathering of the figures shown in this report; participation in web page creation and HSLIC site maintenance training by an ER&A member in order to offer better and timely website service; evaluating the current state of the library catalog and using the information to implement new modules for better staff workflow and customer satisfaction; and, engaging in scholarly communication research and training.

## PRINT RESOURCES & ACQUISITIONS

The reorganization of Collection Resources into two specialized units, Print Resources & Acquisitions (PRA) and Electronic Resources & Access (ERA), allowed the PRA Unit to focus attention on major projects to support HSLIC's partnership with its users.

Staff moved 1970-74 bound journals to the library's offsite storage area, facilitating user access to the more recent materials. At the same time, the unit worked to expand quiet wireless-enabled seating and study space for library users by removing shelves no longer needed in the current journal area due to the availability of electronic content.

Following a decision to increase resources for students and faculty in remote locations by increasing the number of electronic books, HSLIC placed an order for ebooks, using General Obligation Bond money. Over 80 new ebook titles were available by fiscal year end, expanding the variety of avenues our students have for learning. To assure quality service to students and faculty, HSLIC made important decisions about cataloging practices which will streamline access for electronic books and journals. As part of a

quality review of the collection, PRA faculty sought an external review of HSLIC-owned titles and received advice on which titles had newer editions so that these titles could be acquired.

The PRA unit implemented several decisions to improve interlibrary loan services for HSLIC's users. Health Sciences students now receive free interlibrary loans, and the ILLiad interlibrary loan software moved from local servers to a service remotely hosted by the producers of the software. This move provides more security, more support and more timely updates for the service. To conform with UNM accounting practices, HSLIC discontinued deposit accounts for article delivery services; users now make payments via credit card, purchase order or purchase requisition.

Another quality control effort—an update of a national database used for interlibrary loan requests--allowed for an expansion of titles accessible to libraries borrowing from HSLIC under interlibrary loan. The update was the first in nearly ten years and included the addition of electronic journals and closing the records for discontinued print journals.

## DISTANCE SERVICES

The Distance Services program achieved a benchmark year with the successful implementation of the Information for a Healthy New Mexico program, the adoption of new public relations techniques, introduction of technology into delivering instruction at a distance, management of HSLIC's Native American Health Information Services (NAHIS) program, and specialized activities addressing both consumer and professional librarian needs. In FY2007 the Information for a Healthy New Mexico program delivered training to 429 participants in 20 of New Mexico's counties. The Distance Services program expanded to encompass the NAHIS program at HSLIC and also supported the National Library of Medicine's Exhibit Planning Consultation meeting described in the Planning Office section of this report.

Another important accomplishment was a publicity campaign launching New Mexico Health Connection, an online directory of health care services in New Mexico searchable on the web. The directory contains approximately 3000 entries. A public launch of the directory occurred in September with R. Philip Eaton, M.D., Emeritus Vice President for Health Sciences as the featured speaker. This event received coverage in the Albuquerque Journal, and several television stations conducted interviews.

This expansion of publicity efforts continued when HSLIC became one of the featured sponsors of Remaking American Medicine, a series which aired on KNME public television. For the first time this year, HSLIC participated as an exhibitor in the KOAT Health Fair. These new efforts at publicity serve the goal of increasing awareness about HSLIC services by members of the public.

Expanding the repertoire of teaching methodologies for conducting trainings at remote sites in New Mexico, Distance Services partnered with the Center for Development and Disability to use the telemedicine system to deliver two trainings. HSLIC also purchased licenses for Microsoft's Live Meeting, as a possible vehicle for web-delivery of training to remote sites.

In the spring, two instructors from the National Training Center and Clearinghouse spent three days in Albuquerque conducting specialized database training for librarians from HSLIC and hospital libraries. A representative from Amigos Library Systems delivered training on social software in libraries.

Distance Services addressed the specialized needs of HSLIC users at a distance by developing a plan to provide database access for librarians at branch libraries which serve the UNM Health Sciences Center's nursing and pharmacy students and by streamlining payment procedures for orders of searches and articles.

In April, the Distance Services Coordinator, Erinn Aspinall, left HSLIC but continued on a temporary basis to work remotely three hours per week to maintain NMHC.



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## **NATIVE AMERICAN HEALTH INFORMATION SERVICES**

The Native American Health Information Services (NAHIS) program finished its first year goal of marketing its services to Native American students and faculty at the University of New Mexico and the UNM Health Sciences Center. This was done with the help of key partnerships with the Indigenous Nations Library Program at UNM's Zimmerman Library and the Center for Native American Health (CNAH) at the Health Sciences Center. Brochures were distributed to the American Indian Student Services, Native American Studies program, and Center for Native American Health. The Indigenous Nations library program posted an entry on its blog publicizing the NAHIS. Through the CNAH the program's resources were presented at monthly Native health sciences student lunches, a health careers orientation for prospective Native health sciences students and tours of the Health Sciences Library for Native students. The Native Services Librarian began second year activities which focus on public/tribal libraries, with a presentation to the New Mexico tribal librarians' group. The year also saw the successful completion of a public library pilot project with the Shiprock Branch of the Farmington Public Library as part of on-going collaboration and work with the Tribal Connections Four Corners group to meet the goal of service to public/tribal libraries in New Mexico.

The Native Health Databases Advisory Board met twice in 2006-7 with one in person meeting and one teleconference. The Board continues to work on its mission to ensure that the Native Health Databases are a quality, comprehensive source of health/medical information for American Indians, Alaska Natives and Canadian First Nations. A partnership with the Center for Native American Health and Albuquerque Area Indian Health Board through the Native American Research Centers for Health (NARCH) has yielded opportunities for teaching and promotion of the databases, as well as the assignment of a part-time graduate research assistant to verify and help with data entry of older records through the NARCH.

The NAHIS program also contributed to and participated in the Conference on Native American Health Information Services in the United States in July 2006. Funded by the National Library of Medicine through the MidContinental Regional Medical Library, the conference brought together more than 50 participants with an interest in providing high quality health information for Native Americans. The primary outcome of the conference was the decision to create a web portal to foster networking among this community of health information professionals. The National Library of Medicine subsequently identified targeted funding to support the creation of this web portal at HSLIC.

The NAHIS program also participated in a week-long meeting supporting National Library of Medicine staff in planning an exhibit on Native American Concepts of Health and Illness. This meeting is described in the Planning Office section of this report.

## REFERENCE & USER SUPPORT SERVICES

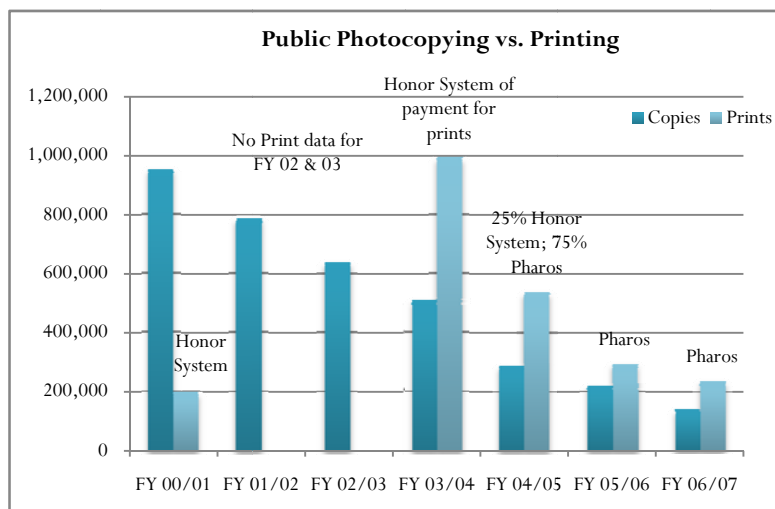
The RUSS group continues to expand library services through addition of new services and by extending the scope of existing services. RUSS and the Information Desk continue to adapt library services to changing use patterns that occur as resources move from print to electronic and from local use to remote access. Patron use of print materials continues to decline, whereas use of electronic resources continues to rise. Despite the availability and popularity of remote access, the actual gate count of people entering the library declined only slightly, averaging close to 700 people per day.

The RUSS group also adapted to the changing nature of the HSC programs and facilities. The construction of the Domenici Center for Health Sciences Education created new roles for RUSS staff as HSLIC accepted management responsibility for the new facility. RUSS staff partnered with HSC education programs to establish policies and procedures for scheduling the two buildings. RUSS staff schedule classes and special events in the Domenici classrooms, meeting space, conference rooms, auditorium, and lobbies, and train student staff to assist instructors, students and visitors for all events, including evenings and weekends. Both the School of Medicine and the College of Nursing expanded their curricular schedules, and RUSS adapted by successfully proposing that the library eliminate summer hours in order to provide a year-around full schedule of physical access to the library building.

Other RUSS service expansions include arranging for the installation of beverage and snack vending machines in the library, developing a means to use the wallpaper feature of library public computers to advertise new products and services, and creating an extensive Reference Resources web page of authoritative medical reference links.

In a major expansion of HSLIC's educational role, RUSS faculty taught an elective on "Information Survival Skills" in the School of Medicine's

Perspectives in Medicine (PIM) program in both the Fall 2006 and Spring 2007 sessions. RUSS faculty also partnered with HSLIC User Support to carry out a needs assessment for the College of Pharmacy which resulted in a plan to improve Pharmacy's IT infrastructure and support.



RUSS faculty and staff worked with representatives from other HSC units to form a committee to investigate assistive technology for library users and to develop recommendations for library administration. The committee drafted a proposal encompassing staff training, building accessibility, and developing a web page of public information on library and other UNM assistive technology resources and capabilities.

Improving the efficiency of Information Desk operations is a strategic goal at HSLIC. To address this, the RUSS group examined data on occurrences of reference assistance and was able to reduce the number of staff and faculty stationed at the Information Desk or on telephone duty without diminishing service. The RUSS group and the strategic planning team will continue to develop means of improving service desk efficiency and effectiveness.

Evening Operations Manager Ed Merta resigned in January, 2007, and after a competitive search, LIS 3 Jim Bynum was named to the Operations Manager position.

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## **SPECIAL COLLECTIONS**

### **New Mexico Health Historical Collection (NMHHC)**

This fiscal year marked a year of change for Special Collections – as the unit expanded electronic access to the collections and invited the community on campus for a variety of special programming. To this end, Special Collections continued to digitize material within the NMHHC by converting 45 oral histories to digital audio files. In addition, Special Collections published to the web its first digitized collection entitled, “Larry J. Gordon Papers.”

Through a new partnership with New Mexico State Records Center and Archives and UNM Center for Southwest Research, Special Collections took part in a state-wide celebration of archives in October. As part of the partnership, Special Collections hosted a viewing of 1930s films from the New Mexico Department of Health, and a lecture by Jake Spidle, Ph.D., UNM Professor of History. Additionally, Special Collections curated an exhibit entitled, “History of Public Health in New Mexico – Selected Stories.” These activities reached over 200 members of the community.

During FY2007, Special Collections completed work under grant-funding to process the Valmora/Gellenthein Collections. The project, funded by the New Mexico Historical Records Advisory Board (NMHRAB), made available records of the Valmora Tuberculosis Sanatorium through processing and publishing of a finding aid to the Rocky Mountain Online Archive.

In order to continue expanding access to key collections, Special Collections submitted a grant proposal to NMHRAB to inventory the Lovelace Foundation and Clayton “Sam” White Papers. The grant was awarded and will support the first year of a two-year project.

### **Hall of Discovery**

Special Collections’ expansion of activities continued with the installation of the inaugural exhibition in the Domenici Center’s Hall of Discovery, “Making a Difference: A Photo Essay.” The exhibit speaks to the HSC’s missions in education, research, and clinical care.

Special Collections also began preparing to host the National Library of Medicine traveling exhibit – “Frankenstein: Penetrating the Secrets of Nature.” The exhibit will be on display March–May 2008. Accompanying the exhibit will be a lecture series highlighting exhibit themes regarding bioethics.

In addition, Special Collections launched a website dedicated to the Hall of Discovery exhibits, produced a five-year exhibit schedule, and continued to plan and seek funding for its feature exhibit – “Portraits of Care: Stories of Health Care in New Mexico.”

### **Phil and Olga Eaton Sculpture Garden of Healing**

During FY2007, the Sculpture Garden of Healing moved from a planning activity to a build-out of the northern-part of the Canyon Garden. The construction included terraced gardens, a concert platform, and seating area called the “zócalo.”

In order to complete the Canyon Garden, Special Collections developed a partnership with the UNM College of Architecture and Planning and Office of Planning and Space Management to create innovative solutions for the refurbishment of the southern part of the garden.

In May, the UNM Board of Regents approved naming opportunities for the Canyon Garden, serving as a basis for a fundraising effort to finance the remaining elements of the garden.

## TECHNOLOGY SUPPORT

### EMERGING TECHNOLOGIES

The focus of the Emerging Technology group continues to be next generation collaboration services and enabling the campus-wide infrastructure and partnerships necessary to provide access to robust collaboration services. The vast majority of knowledge tasks are collaborative in some way, relying on the transfer of knowledge between people. People meet to share ideas, coordinate their actions, review plans and documents, and notify one another of project status. The following figure shows the different types of collaboration, ranging from ad hoc to structured, and from asynchronous to real-time:

The Emerging Technology group's strategy is to develop enterprise collaboration solutions that integrate these collaborative activities to provide value for people, the Health Sciences Center, UNM, and its partners. Solutions designed to provide one or two free-standing collaborative capabilities, but lacking consistency and integration with enterprise platforms and applications, create complexity and duplication of IT investments, confuse end users and increase training and support requirements. The Emerging Technologies Group believes the solution is to view collaboration as a strategic capability, best addressed by a technology platform designed specifically to integrate collaboration with information management and structured processes.

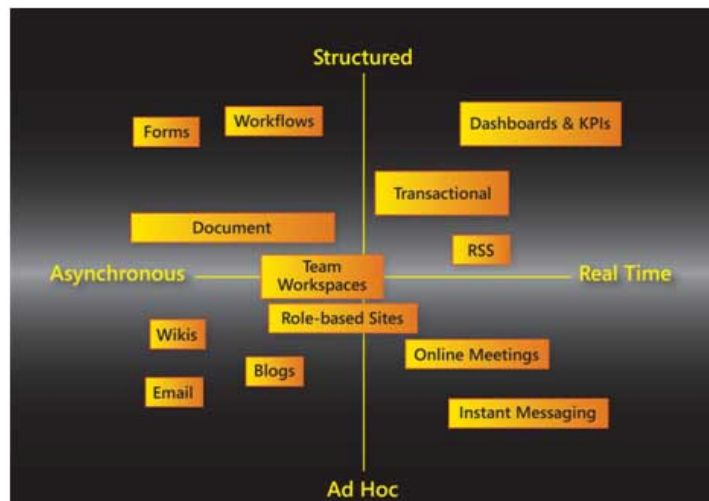
The Emerging Technology group realizes as part of its enterprise collaboration strategy that fundamental infrastructure and HSC and university-wide partnerships must be enabled for this strategy to be successful. These include:

**Platform Licensing:** In February 2007, an agreement was signed that provides all non-clinical HSC faculty and staff access to core Microsoft platforms. The agreement also provides client licenses for Windows services such as Microsoft Office SharePoint Server. SharePoint is the key component of the Emerging Technology group's enterprise collaboration strategy. SharePoint addresses collaboration as one part of the larger issue of business productivity. The ability to share documents in workspaces, invoke real-time communication services, schedule

appointments, publish and subscribe to content, and other collaborative activities exists side-by-side with tools for knowledge management, project management, and structured workflow.

**Identity Management:** In Spring 2007, the Emerging Technology group participated in the formation of a university-wide Identity Management Project Charter. The project will enhance information security, enhance privacy and reduce identity and information theft, provide budgetary and resource efficiencies, and most importantly for collaboration technologies provide a unified identity services infrastructure that will be utilized for new and existing information systems. Without this identity system layer the ability to provide next generation collaboration technologies to the HSC and the University is virtually impossible.

**Communications and Training Planning:** The Emerging Technology group recognizes, as others also recognize, that key to the successful implementation of an enterprise collaboration technology strategy is the development of a communications plan that helps people know what services are available. As important, is a training plan that provides users with the skills they need to use collaboration tools effectively. The Emerging Technology group actively works with other HSC and University-wide planning and technology groups to ensure that these planning and training tools and systems are developed and implemented



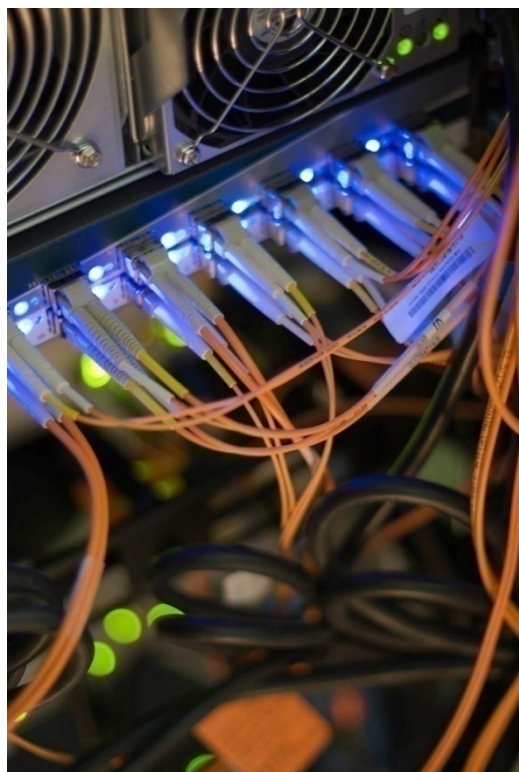


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## INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SYSTEMS

In FY2007 the Systems group focused on the basics of maintenance, upgrades and core services, activities which led the group to review and renew ties with partners at the HSC and to main campus. The continued high rate of growth in the amount of storage, the level of processor utilization, and network bandwidth usage, meant that resources were stretched thin. To maintain the level of quality and service which users have come to expect, Systems emphasized interdependence and partnerships. In particular, Systems staff extended the use of the CommVault backup software, which was purchased jointly between UNMH and HSLIC; started a conversation with ITS about a joint effort on SPAM control; and supported the research community in its Clinical Translational Science Center proposal by highlighting IT services which would support the project. Systems also worked closely with departments that have special projects and resource needs.



The Systems group also contributed to deploying and extending services as part of HSLIC's strategic initiatives. The use of Active Directory became the standard management tool for workstations deployed at the HSC. Systems also pilot-tested SharePoint as a for document sharing and began discussing this technology with ITS as an enterprise service.

Systems approached a goal of better understanding the data management needs of HSC departments by creating a survey which was sent out to HSC users to identify their reasons for creating databases as well as problems encountered in database design, data collection, and report production. The results revealed that report production from locally created databases is the most common concern of users, followed by importing and exporting data, and database design. HSLIC is now working to promote supportable, sustainable database standards. Many of the departmentally-created databases use MS Access, in contrast to HSLIC-supported databases in MS SQL or Oracle. The survey has helped the Systems group to better understand the needs of HSC users and to assist with their most difficult data management issues.

As the end of the fiscal year approached, Systems turned to new strategic initiatives identified in HSLIC's strategic planning process. One of the most pressing issues affecting the quality of our IT services, identity management, is an important new objective for Systems. Although the group successfully crafted account management standards and developed directory services, all the components required for identity management have never been assembled cohesively, due primarily to governance issues. The new UNM IT governance process positions HSLIC to achieve the benefits of Identity Management.

## USER SUPPORT SERVICES

In FY2006 User Support Services (USS) accomplished the goal of solidifying support standards and goals that achieved efficiency and cost effectiveness. In FY2007 USS expanded upon the previous year's goals by focusing on providing quality technical support for the Health Sciences Center (HSC) community. USS is expanding its role to accomplish many initiatives associated with services and partnerships.

In FY2007 USS integrated new technology into the HSC environment over the entire fiscal year. New technologies integrated this year are the new version of Internet Explorer, the new version of Banner, and the annual Faculty Workstation Project. These services and technologies were introduced in a phased approach to ensure that each one was adopted and integrated individually to minimize the impact and cost to the HSC.

USS is also working to expand and integrate more services in the upcoming year which currently will include Microsoft Office 2007 and the Microsoft Windows Vista operating system. Testing of these services took place during FY2007 to ensure that there will be minimal impact and cost to the institution when implemented. USS also looks forward to providing high end desktops and laptops

through the Faculty Workstation Project again in the upcoming year.

Also during FY2007, USS expanded its role of supporting educational technology by developing and supporting the technology needs of the Domenici Center. USS staff equipped a new auditorium, two new classrooms, and meeting rooms with technology to support the use of the various spaces. This effort will expand again in the near future as more classrooms in Domenici Center are established and technical needs change.

One of the most significant accomplishments achieved by USS this fiscal year was to expand its partnerships at the HSC. USS works with various departments by providing direct support or indirect support through a departmental contact or a departmental technician who is managed by the HSC department. To align the needs of specific departments and the support standards of the HSC, HSLIC formed partnerships with the Department of Pediatrics, Dental Services, and the College of Pharmacy to provide departmental technical support staff that is managed by USS. This type of expanded support model within the HSC has been a great success and an excellent example of how HSLIC can accomplish greater things with the resources already present.

### **WEB DEVELOPMENT TEAM**

**Kevin Wiley, MS, Manger, Systems and Programming**

The web team partnered with key academic components and departments on several large web site redesigns in FY2007. First was the School of Medicine (SOM) web site. The new site focuses on the SOM's largest web audience: prospective students. The site also uses the current style sheet based templates. The Web Team also worked with the SOM Department of Internal Medicine to redesign and redeploy its web site. This large project involved both the Web Team and over twenty web authors from Internal Medicine.

In addition to redesign projects and ongoing maintenance work on over 100 web sites, the Web Team took another step toward Web 2.0 by using the Google Maps API (Application Programming Interface) to create the HSC Online Map. This map is available at <http://hsc.unm.edu/about/map/>. Using the Google API allowed the Web Team to leverage a powerful set of technology tools for HSC use. Extending services offered on the HSC site in this way improves the user experience for all visitors to the HSC site.

Usage of the HSC web sites changed noticeably in FY2007. In previous years static pages, primarily the home pages of HSC components, were the most visited pages. Four pages new to the Top 10 are: Find a Doctor, HSC Calendar, HSC News Releases and Faculty Job Postings. The high use of these pages reflects a change in what people want from web sites. In addition to basic information, users are looking for ways to interact online with organizations. The Web Team will continue to work towards online interactivity.

The Web Team continued to work on a wide range of database applications for partners at the Health Sciences Center. A small sample of projects the Web Team worked on are listed below.

- The Web Team modified the Academic Affairs faculty contract database and related business processes to accommodate the need to upload data into the new human resources component of the university-wide Banner system. This required programming changes as well as changes to the faculty database.
- Working with the HSLIC Business Office, the Web Team modified the HSLIC Library Management System. New functionality includes the ability to track hours spent on specific projects.
- The Internet Based Health Risk Assessment project, begun in FY2005, went live and plans for a second phase are underway.
- The first online versions of the Locum Tenens and Specialty Extension Services applications went live. The Web Team continues to work on these applications.
- The RIOS Net members' site was modified and turned into a truly data-driven web site with current member information.
- The Web Team worked with the SOM Office of Admissions to make extensive modifications to the admissions program used by applicants and the admissions committee. These changes streamlined the admissions process.
- The MEDS curriculum database is now ready to roll out to more users within the School of Medicine. Modifications include the ability to upload files needed to build cases and an enhanced curricular calendar.

**Bridges for Health Information - Resource Library Outreach Subcontract** (Erinn Aspinall, MLIS and Janis Teal, MLS, MAT, Principal Investigators). HSLIC proposes to conduct 18 training sessions for unaffiliated New Mexicans through support from this contract. (National Network of Libraries of Medicine through the South Central Regional Medical Library (Houston Academy of Medicine-Texas Medical Center); N01-LM-6-3505; \$12,000; May 2007 – April 2008).

**Clinical and Translational Science Center at the University of New Mexico** (Mark Burge, M.D., Director, University of New Mexico Clinical and Translational Science Center, Principal Investigator). The purpose of this planning grant is to develop the resources necessary to apply for, and procure, a Clinical Translational Science Center (CTSC) award at the University of New Mexico Health Sciences Center. Dr. Kroth wrote the biomedical informatics section of this planning grant application. This funding, along with direct support from HSLIC, supports Dr. Kroth's efforts as Director of the Biomedical Informatics Support Unit in the UNM CTSC. (National Center for Research Resources; NCRR 1 P20 RR023493-01; FY2007 HSLIC component: \$11,975; September 2006 – September 2007).

**Conference on Tribal Health Information** (Janis Teal, MLS, MAT, Principal Investigator). Funding to host a nationwide conference on the provision of health information services for Native Americans in order to increase collaboration and networking. (National Network of Libraries of Medicine through the MidContinental Regional Medical Library (Eccles Library, University of Utah; N01-LM-3514; \$62,259; September 2005 – August 2006).

**Information for a Healthy New Mexico - Resource Library Outreach Subcontract** (Erinn Aspinall, MLIS, Principal Investigator). Contract supported 9 training sessions for 142 participants in a shortened contract year (7 months rather than 12 months). It also supported the purchase of an LCD projector, a web camera, Microsoft Live Meeting software and promotional pens. (National Network of Libraries of Medicine through the South Central Regional Medical Library (Houston Academy of Medicine-Texas Medical Center); N01-LM-6-3505; \$12,000; October 2006 – April 2007).

**Integrating and Expanding Clinical Research Networks: RIOS Net and Underrepresented Populations** (Robert Williams, M.D., Director RIOS Net (Research in the Outpatient Setting) & Professor, Family and Community Medicine, Principal Investigator). Dr. Kroth acts as a biomedical informatics consultant and chairs the IS Steering Committee for this project. This \$3.3 million, 3-year contract is targeted to expand and standardize the capability of RIOS Net's IT infrastructure. RIOS Net is one of 13 research networks participating in this NHLBI program. The contract is well into the third year and has already exceeded its IT and informatics goals of creating a cache of reusable, standardized data collection and storage tools. Laurie McPherson and Anthony Adams from the TECHS group are 100% funded through this contract and Dr. Kroth is funded at 0.15 FTE. (National Heart Lung and Blood Institute; BAA-RM-04-23; FY 2007 HSLIC component: \$255,765; October 2004 – September 2007).

**National Library of Medicine Individual Biomedical Informatics Fellowship Grant** (Randall Stewart, M.D. Fellow, Principal Investigator). Dr. Randall Stewart was one of nine people nationwide to be awarded a three year, National Library of Medicine Individual Biomedical Informatics Fellowship in August of 2005. This funding provides support for Dr. Stewart's research and biomedical informatics training activities for three years. Dr. Stewart's research involves determining the impact of the presence of an electronic medical record system on patient satisfaction in the behavioral health environment. (National Library of Medicine; 5 F37 LM008747-02; 3-yr total: \$199,000; August 2005 – July 2008).

**National Library of Medicine, Native American Concepts of Health and Illness Santa Fe Exhibit Consultation** (Holly Shipp Buchanan, MLn, MBA, EdD, Principal Investigator). Funding to host a day-and-a-half consultation meeting and visits with representatives from New Mexico Pueblos for a proposed National Library of Medicine exhibit entitled Native American Concepts of Health and Illness. (Center for Public Service Communications; \$54,092; September 2006 – July 2007; and University of Maryland; N01-LM01-3522 and N01-LM-3514 \$20,000; September 2006 – December 2006).

**Oral Histories – New Mexico Medical Society** (Janis Teal, MLS, MAT, Principal Investigator). Special Collections continued its long standing relationship with the New Mexico Medical Society to fund oral histories for the NMHHC. UNM History Professor Jake Spidle conducted interviews with Arthur Kaufmann, M.D., and Ann Wadstrom, M.D. Transcriptions are pending. (New Mexico Medical Society; 322S1; \$6,000; April 2006 – March 2008).

**Outreach Connections: Native Health Web Portal** (Janis Teal, MLS, MAT, Principal Investigator). This funding supports the development of a web-accessible portal for the sharing of resources and effective practices by anyone interested in providing quality health information to Native Americans. It is a follow-on to the Conference on Tribal Health Information. (National Network of Libraries of Medicine through the MidContinental Regional Medical Library (Eccles Library, University of Utah); N01-LM-6-3504; \$26,990; January 2007 – December 2008).

**P30 Cancer Center Support Grant** (Cheryl Willman, M.D., Director, University of New Mexico Cancer Research and Treatment Center, (CRTC) Principal Investigator). Dr. Kroth was part of the P30 grant writing team. This funding supports Dr. Kroth's efforts as Co-Director of the Clinical Protocol and Data Management/Medical Informatics Shared Resource in the UNM CRTC. Dr. Kroth acts as a biomedical informatics consultant to CRTC on biomedical informatics issues and related projects. This year, Dr. Kroth has been primarily involved with the continued development of the UNM Human Tissue Repository and Experimental Pathology Laboratory, a joint effort between the Department of Pathology and the CRTC as well as the CRTC's response to the National Cancer Institute's request for information on its CaBIG project. (National Cancer Institute; 1P30-CA-118100-1 FY 2007 HSLIC component: \$19,054; September 2005 – August 2010).

**Southern Colorado New Mexico Native American Research Center for Health (SoCoNM NARCH)** (Robert Williams, M.D., Professor, Family and Community Medicine, Principal Investigator). The goals of the SoCoNM NARCH are to expand research on health disparities affecting American Indians in New Mexico, to address research topics that are priorities to these American Indian communities, to enhance acceptance by these communities of research and to build a core of American Indian health researchers in New Mexico. The Health Sciences Library and Informatics Center (HSLIC) is part of the UNM core of the NARCH. The HSLIC Native Health Databases provide a clearinghouse function for high quality, single source of information and resources focused on contemporary and historical American Indian, Alaska Native and Canadian First Nations health/medical issues to support current and future research. (Department of Health and Human Services; U26IHS300009; \$500,000; September 2005 – August 2009).

**Valmora / Gellenthien Collection – New Mexico Historical Records Advisory Board** (Janis Teal, MLS, MAT, Principal Investigator). During FY2007, Special Collections completed the grant funded project which involved the following tasks: production of an inventory, cleaning and re-housing materials, accessioning and physically locating the collections, and publishing a finding aid to the Rocky Mountain Online Archive. (New Mexico Historical Records Advisory Board; 07-010; \$3,000; July 2006 – June 2007).

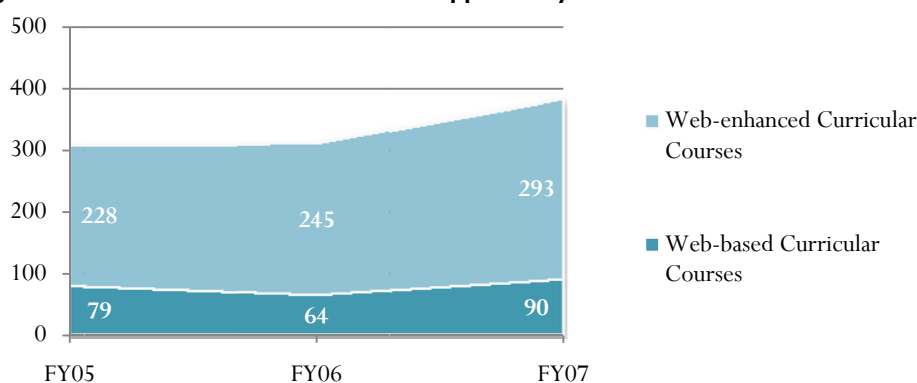

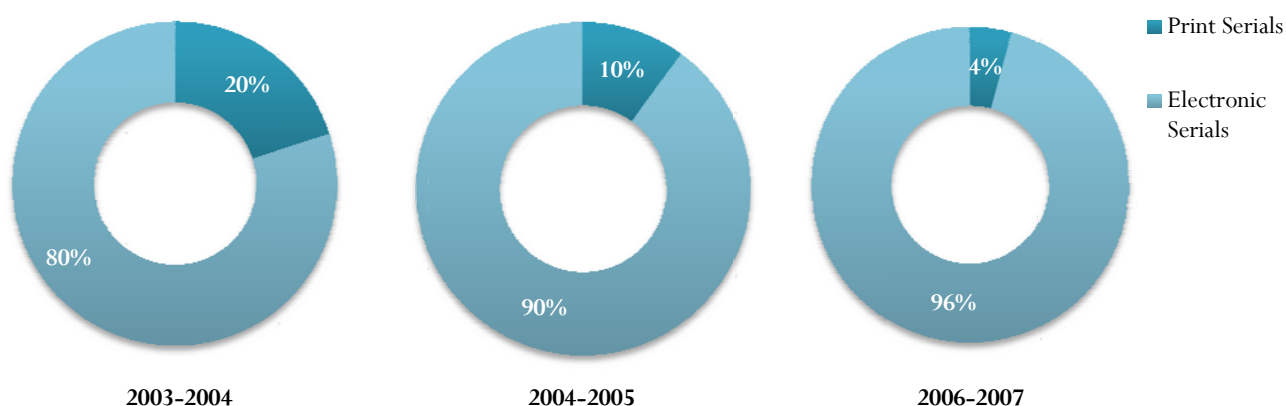

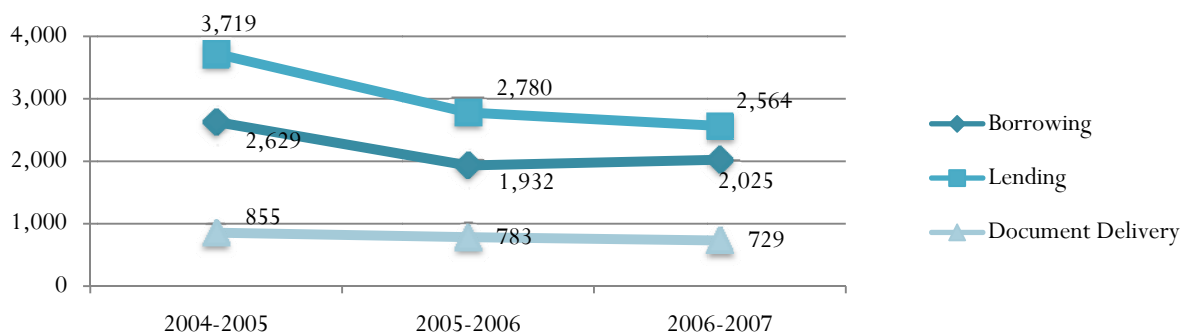
**Figure 3: Collection Development (General Expenditures – Percents)**

**Figure 4: Interlibrary Loan/Document Delivery Trends**

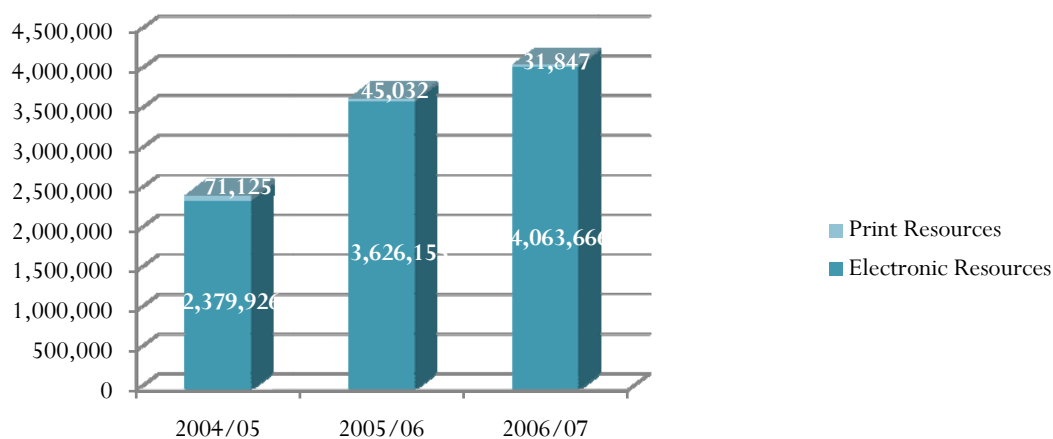

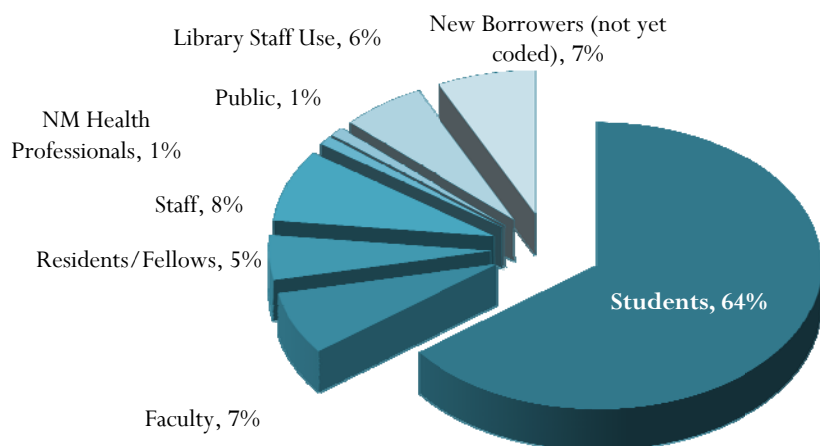

**Figure 6: Checkouts by User Groups**

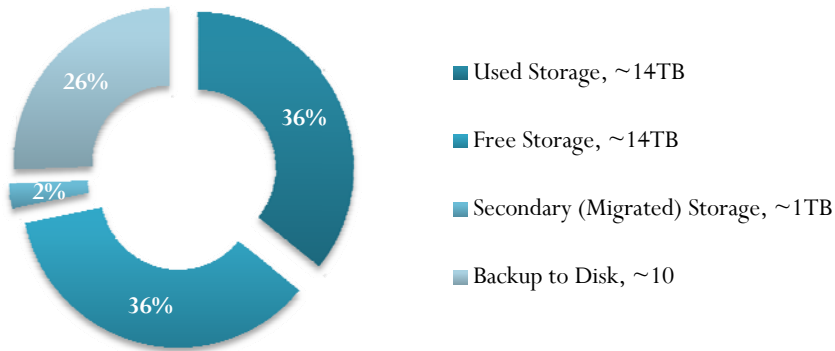

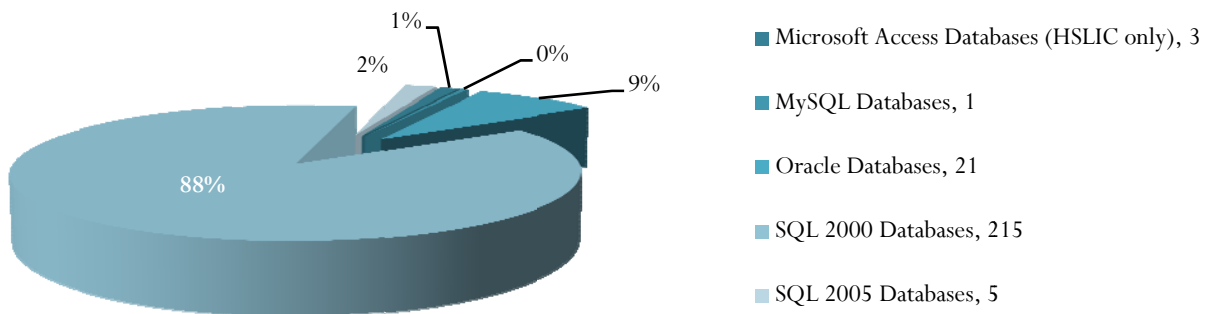

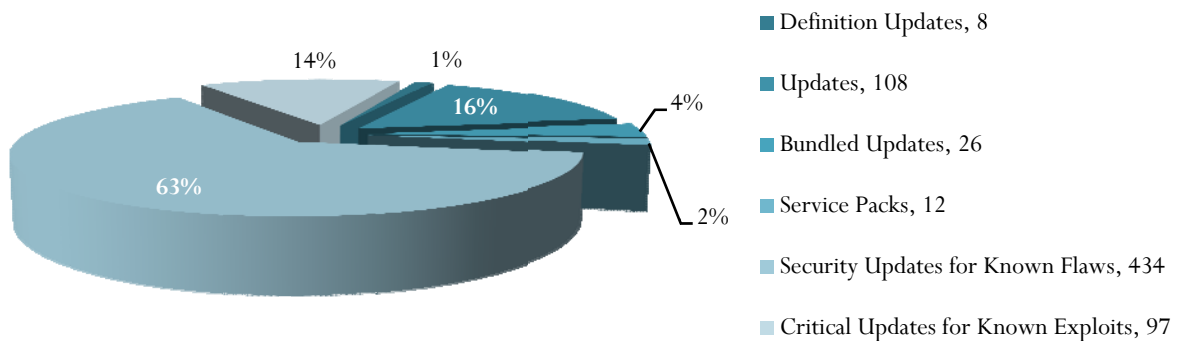
**Figure 7: HSLIC Storage Capacity in Terabytes (TB) (across all server platforms) - ~28 TB Total**



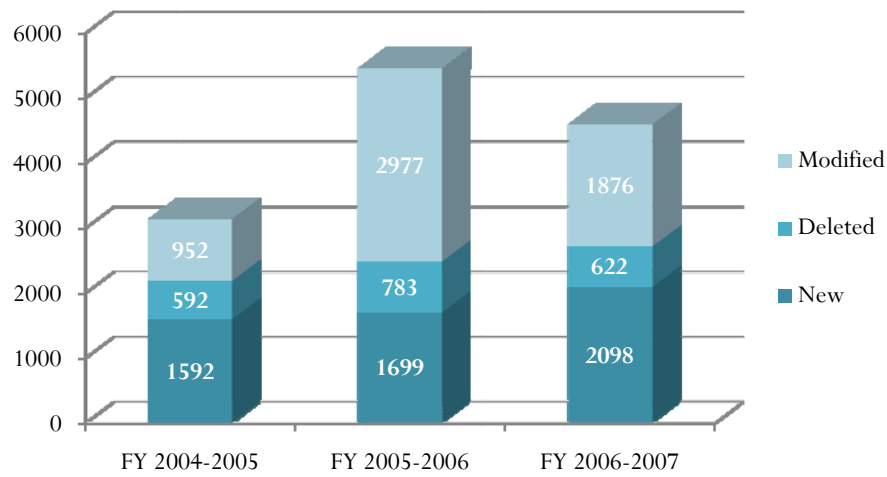
**Figure 8: HSLIC Managed Databases by Application – 168 Total**

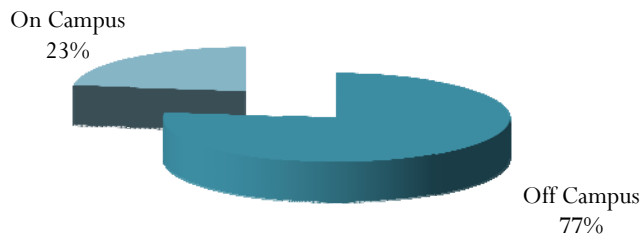

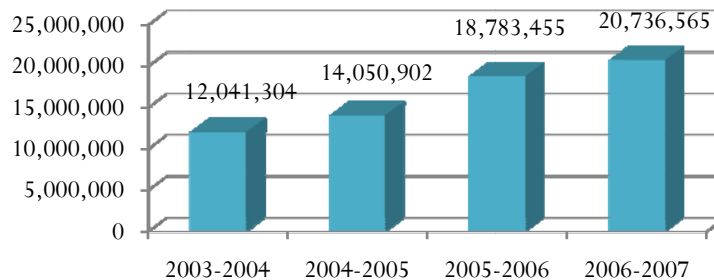
